# Bookselling and Publishing in Britain from Caxton to recent times

# A five hundred year history

A unique collection of 1,091 antiquarian, scarce and scholarly titles

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## INTRODUCTION

This remarkable collection of over a thousand titles documents the history and development of bookselling and publishing in Britain from William Caxton (c.1422-1492), who introduced printing into England and was the first publisher, to recent times. It has been assembled over fifty years by Chris Kohler, one of England's foremost antiquarian booksellers in the building of important special collections.

Thomas Carlyle, the great English man of letters, declared: "that ten ordinary histories of kings and courtiers were well exchanged against the tenth part of one good History of Booksellers". [item 808, p.1]

The establishment by William Caxton of his printing press in Westminster, in 1476, created what became the modern British publishing industry. The publisher is the organiser who takes the manuscript from the author, and arranges the printing of the book and its sale to the public. The publisher is the capitalist of the world of books. It was the invention of printing that led to the establishment of the modern publishing industry. Caxton was the first publisher in Britain [items 171-197] and the early book trade was organised through the Stationers' Company [items 953-969]. From the end of the 15th century well into the 18th century the function of publishing was performed by the printers and the booksellers.

The Government and the Stationers' Company, founded in 1403, controlled the book trade through registration, which guaranteed the authenticity of any publication and copyright law, which protected the publisher/printer's rights to benefit from that guarantee and protect his investment. Issues of censorship, religious controversy and foreign policy were also involved in the control of printing at the time. Printing was restricted to London, which meant that the Company and the government could control the output. By the end of the 17th century the Stationers' Company's monopoly powers were being increasingly circumvented by provincial publishers, printers and non-guild members and in 1709, the first modern copyright law was passed. Although the further development of copyright law has been focused on the protection of the author's identification with his creation, the publisher continues to benefit from it in that it protects his involvement in the publication and sale of of the book.

The two exceptions to the concentration of printing in London were Oxford and Cambridge. In 1586 the University in Oxford was granted one printer and printing press by decree of the Star Chamber [for the history of Oxford University Press, see items 704-722]. The University of Cambridge is the site of the oldest publishing and printing business in the world having been operating since 1584 [for the history of Cambridge University Press, see items 139-160].

By the end of the 18th century the separation of roles between printer and bookseller started to become standard practice and the "publisher" was born. Throughout the 18th and early 19th centuries many of the famous publishing dynasties were already staking their claims to power, including the houses of both Longman founded in 1725 [items 121 and 551-555] and Macmillan in 1843 [items 571-580] in London. The importance of Edinburgh can be seen in the founding of A. & C. Black in 1807 [items 78-79], Blackwood's in 1804 [items 86-89], Constable in 1795 [items 260-261] and Murray in 1768 [items 643-652].

The 19th century, with its dramatic increase in rates of literacy, saw a parallel increase in the number of publishers and booksellers, supplying millions of books on hundreds of different subjects. The greatest revolution in 20th-century British publishing was the introduction in 1935 of cheap well-made paperbacks by Penguin Books, thus making books available to the masses. The collection includes no less than 19 different items on Penguin Books [items 730-748].

Once publishers ceased to be distributors to the final customers, bookselling became a separate trade. The collection contains good material on 19th and 20th-century booksellers whose primary activity was as booksellers rather than publishers. There was no recognised distinction between booksellers of new and booksellers of old books until recent times. Included are items about the great Oxford bookshop Blackwell's [items 82-85], their Cambridge rival Heffer's [item 443], the London firms of Foyles [items 370-372], Hatchards [items 433-434] and Dillon's [item 302], as well as the national chain W.H. Smith [items 909-913]. These big businesses, with the exception of W.H. Smith, all sold old as well as new books. Items on the antiquarian trade include material on the giants Quaritch [items 789-790] and Maggs [items 340 and 581-584] in London's West End as well as the Robinson Brothers (originally from Newcastle) [items 810-811], Marks (made famous by 84, Charing Cross Road) [items 593-595], and specialists like Ben Weinreb [item 1058] and Bertram Rota [items 822-827] as well as Wheldon & Wesley in Hertfordshire [items 1061-1065]. There are excellent runs of directories of the antiquarian trade from Arthur Gyles's The Directory of Second-hand Booksellers, 1886 [item 212], followed by succeeding Clega directories [items 213-218], and other directories published by The Clique [items 222-233], Coe [items 236-240], Cole [items 241-248], Driffield [items 312-314], Sheppards [items 864-893] and Skoob [items 901-907]. Auction sales are significant in the buying and selling of old books and here is material on Bloomsbury Book Auctions [item 96], Christie's [items 208 and 947], Hodgsons [item 458] and Sotheby's [items 944-947]. Out of Print and Into Profit edited by Giles Mandelbrote [item 587] is the first book to deal with the history of the rare and secondhand book trade in Britain in the 20th century.

The collection includes almost all the important books that have been published on the subject, together with unusual and rare pamphlets that are stored in 31 separate boxes and are noted in the catalogue. Around half of the items in the collection are studies of over 260 different firms in the book trade. The balance of items deal with more than fifty different subjects. See the separate "List of Subjects covered in the collection" at the end of this introduction.

This unique collection provides a splendid basis for research into all aspects of the publishing and bookselling trades in Britain during the last five hundred years. The History of the Book is one of the fastest growing academic disciplines today. Here are over a thousand items of good basic material for its study. British publishing and bookselling history is part of the wider social, political and economic tapestry of the country's life during the period. In the last century, the British publishing industry exported some 40% of its output, reflecting the significance of English as an international language. The British publishing and bookselling trades are amongst the most important ones in the world. We believe this to be the largest and most important private collection on the history and development of publishing and bookselling since Caxton, ever to have been offered for sale.

## Notes on assembling the collection By Chris Kohler

I was eighteen when I started buying old books. I was at school in York and my first purchase, in 1960, was a six-volume 18th-century edition of Laurence Sterne's *The Life and Opinions of Tristram Shandy* in Godfrey's bookshop in York [see item 388].

After leaving school I started work at E. Joseph, an antiquarian bookshop in the Charing Cross Road in London [item 504]. I started to learn about bookselling - sweep out the shop, light the fire, put bookcases on the pavement outside the shop, learn how to pack parcels, etc. - and soon started to buy books about the trade. I think the first three books I bought were Carter's *ABC for Book-collectors* [item 165], Percy Muir's *An Autobiography: Minding My Own Business* [item 332] which starts with his joining Elkin Mathews, a famous firm of antiquarian booksellers, in 1930, and a book about Foyles Bookshop (a few hundred yards up the road from Joseph's) called *The Romance of a Bookshop* by Gilbert Fabes, published in 1929 [item 370]. This was the beginning of a collection which now, fifty years later, is offered here for sale. I left Joseph's on my 21st birthday in 1963 and have been buying and selling old books ever since.

The collection has grown slowly - hundreds of separate purchases over some fifty years. I bought some of the books when they were first published, and some from my travelling round the country visiting bookshops to acquire books for the many collections that we assembled. I bought much of the most interesting and unusual material from booksellers specialising in bibliography and book trade history. Although some of these specialist booksellers had shops, most of them were catalogue booksellers. I remember buying from the catalogues of V.J. Moss in Preston, Barry McKay in the Lake District, Scott Brinded in Kent, Claude Cox in Ipswich, Will Laywood and Frances Wakemen both in Nottinghamshire, and Oak Knoll in Delaware, USA. I think the largest number of items I ever bought at once was some forty books and pamphlets from one of the catalogues of Peter Wright of Aberystwyth whose outstanding series of five catalogues on bibliography and the history of the book trade are included in this collection [item 1083].

## Frontispiece illustration of Caxton

The frontispiece to the catalogue shows the Caxton Memorial Window in St. Margaret's Church Westminster where Caxton is buried. This beautiful stained glass window was erected in 1882 by public subscription, mainly from printers and publishers. It shows Caxton demonstrating his press to Edward IV, his Queen and the Prince of Wales [see item 184].
